

How to find the Orangerie Schönbrunn?

Schönbrunner Schlossstrasse 47, 1130 Vienna, Austria



Arriving by car

If you arrive by car, there are three possibilities:

Coming from the south: Highway A2

Take the direction to the city centre until exit "Altmannsdorf", then drive straight ahead to "Schloss Schönbrunn".

Coming from the west: Highway A1

Drive along Schönbrunner Schlossstrasse towards the city, pass the main gate of Schönbrunn Palace until you reach the pedestrian lights. The entrance of the Orangerie is on the right side.

Coming from the east (A4) or the north (A22): Highway A23

direction Vienna, then change to A23 (Südosttangente) direction "Graz" and finally take the exit "Altmannsdorf". Then drive straight ahead to "Schloss Schönbrunn".

A big parking lot – **APCOA Parking** – is located directly opposite the entrance of the Orangerie on the left side of Schönbrunner Schlossstrasse.

Arrival by plane


Nearby airports: Vienna – 32 km Bratislava – 100 km
